Featuring in this newsletter, Isabelle Freeman

Isabelle Freeman (soprano) is this year's recipient of the Bendat Scholarship, and Emerging Young Artist at the West Australian Opera. 2014 is Isabelle's first year in the program, and she will make her WAO Chorus debut this year in The Magic Flute. Isabelle currently studies under the tutelage of Patricia Price and has completed a Bachelor of Music and a Graduate Diploma at the Western Australian Academy of Performing arts.

During her time at WAAPA, Isabelle had the privilege of performing the role of Katherine in the Australian premier of "The Taming of the Shrew" by Hermann



Goetz, the soprano in Mendelssohn's Elijah, excerpts of Anne Truelove, from Stravinsky's "The Rake's Progress" as well as being selected to represent WAAPA at the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting opening ceremony, performing for world leaders, including Her Majesty the Queen Elizabeth II. Isabelle has been accepted into Mannes College in New York City with a partial scholarship to study a Masters of Music under the tutelage of Ruth Falcon.
