OperaBox will tell you all about the company and their exciting next production - the modern Australian Premiere of Donizetti's Tudor Queen opera *Anna Bolena*. This will be followed by a special performance of excerpts from the opera by the cast of *Anna Bolena*.

After the success of the TV series *The Tudors*, *Anna Bolena* now has a place in the repertory of opera houses all over the world but has not been performed in Australia since 1875. Opera Lovers have this unique opportunity to hear about the company, to hear from the opera's Creative Team and to hear some of the opera's excerpts before it is performed as part of the Perth FRINGE WORLD Festival from 25th January - 4th February 2015. Did you hear ...

The announcement that 'the winner of the 2014 Opera Awards is New Zealand-born tenor **Jonathan Abernethy**. Jonathan was selected by an eminent judging panel comprising musician and artist Dr Di Bresciani OAM, legendary bass Conal Coad, celebrated soprano Rachelle Durkin and maestro Gregory Hocking.

The Opera Awards is the first major competition for singing that Jonathan has ever entered. As winner of the 2014 Opera Awards, Jonathan was awarded the YMFAustralia Award of \$30,000, the Armstrong-Martin Scholarship of \$4,500 and entry to the Britten-Pears Young Artist Programme which gives artists the opportunity to participate in a high-calibre international masterclass course or opera production led by eminent musicians in the UK.
